As of March 2012 all new construction and alterations to facilities covered by the ADA must comply with the Department of Justice's 2010 ADA standards for accessible design, known as the 2010 Standards. This presentation will highlight the differences between the 2010 Standards and the 1991 Standards. Frequently asked questions about the new standards and other areas where guidance is often requested will be discussed.
