Notice

The Chief Procurement Office reminds vendors of the prohibition on political contributions found in Section 50-37 of the Illinois Procurement Code. [30 ILCS 500/50-37](#). Every person or entity interested in doing business with the State of Illinois is encouraged to be familiar with this section of the Code and to seek legal advice as to how this section affects your business.

In most cases, campaign contributions to the Governor and Lieutenant Governor as well as all declared candidates for those offices are prohibited. In addition, campaign contributions made by entities and persons affiliated with a business to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or candidates for those offices are prohibited. If a vendor is found to violate this prohibition, contracts between State agencies and the vendor are voidable by the Chief Procurement Officer. If a vendor violates this prohibition 3 or more times within a 36-month period, the Chief Procurement Officer is required to void all contracts between State agencies and the vendor.
