Exports are a Significant Portion of Illinois' Economy^A

- Illinois exports totaled over \$59.72 billion in 2019. The agricultural adjusted figure for 2019 is \$62.45 billion.^C
- Since 2009, Illinois exports have increased by \$18.10 billion, or 43.5%.
- Illinois is the largest exporting state in the Midwest and the 4th largest in the nation, using agricultural adjusted figures provided by Census Bureau, **a record high.**^C
- 18 out of top 20 industrial categories declined 2018-2019.
- 18 out of top 20 industrial categories increased 2009-2019.
- Top 10 Illinois export categories have seen gains since 2009.
- 9 of the top 10 Illinois export partner countries have seen gains since 2009.
- Export activities support over 800,000 jobs in Illinois.^B

Total Trade between Illinois and Asia in 2019

- Illinois exports to Asia totaled \$12.51 billion in 2019, a 19.0% increase since 2009. Illinois' top 5 partner countries are China, Japan, Hong Kong, Singapore, and South Korea.
- Illinois ranks 8th among the 50 U.S. states in exports to Asia.
- Illinois imports from Asia totaled \$73.66 billion in 2019, a 111.1% increase since 2009. Illinois' top 5 partner countries are China, Japan, Vietnam, Korea, and Singapore.
- Illinois ranks 3rd among the 50 U.S. states in imports from Asia.

Asian Foreign Direct Investment in Illinois^D

- Illinois ranks #3 in the nation and Chicago ranks #1 amongst largest metro areas for new and expanding corporate locations.
- Illinois is home to over 2,037 foreign firms that employ more than 328,000 Illinois residents.
- Asian firms employ 65,340 Illinoisans at 1,489 distinct locations for 627 subsidiaries.
- Asia, if a country, would be Illinois' largest FDI partner by employment.

^C: Export statistics are based on Origin of Movement methodology by the Census Bureau which collects information from the Customs and Border Protection from bills of lading. Has a known and important shortcoming especially with regards to agriculture consolidation and consolidation in general at coastal ports. Logistics companies and commodity trading firms may be the exporter of record even though the products came from a different state/producer.

For the State of Illinois, analytical adjustments of census data by WISER Trade using USDA farm cash receipts yields a 2018 export total of 62.45 Billion a \$2.52 Billion-dollar difference. Boosts Illinois to 4th position nationwide. Agricultural adjusted trade figures are only available from 2012. Rank tied in 2012 and 2014.
