## 3. Updates to 2017 Illinois Child Well-Being Study (Dr. Ted Cross):

- A point in time study of a random sample of 700 children and youth in out-of-home care on October 23, 2017.
- Children's time in care ranged from a few months to 16 years with the median time in care being 1.7 years.
- Through partnership with NU and University of Chicago there was an opportunity to not only streamline collecting data, but to maintain a database of the CANS. From this process data was able to be merged from the NU database and the 2017 study. From there, there was an opportunity to examine new insights about the Integrated Assessment and address the following research questions:
- Is the IA CANS related to child and youth needs while they are in care?
- Is the IA CANS still relevant when children and youth have been in care for long periods?

Three groups were then compared on well-being in care based on IA CANS score:

- IA CANS Behavioral and Emotional Needs scale = 0, No evidence (no need for action)
- IA CANS Behavioral and Emotional Needs scale = 1, Watchful waiting, prevention (efforts are needed to monitor this need or engage in activities to ensure that it does not become worse)
- IA CANS Behavioral and Emotional Needs scale = 2 or 3, Action needed

## Other data highlights from the study:

- A number of children and youth in DCFS care are resilient despite adverse childhood experiences (ACEs).
- We have more stats on children who are functioning poorly than children who are resilient.
