Volume of Orders of Appointment

• The number of new Orders entered by the Courts continues to be lower. We hypothesize this could be due to the continuing pandemic which may have prioritized other aspects of life over the desire or need to search for birth relatives, the use of commercial DNA services through which individuals are making connections without agency assistance, and/or other factors unknown to us at this time.

Types of Petitioners

 Adult Adoptees remain the largest category of petitioners. Exact numbers of the petitioner types served are included on the Service Statistics document.

Number of Searches Requested

• The majority of petitioners do not request more than three separate searches. There continue to be some petitioners who request five or more individual searches, but not many. Those individuals are typically adoptees who request a search beyond the birth parents either due to the birth parents being deceased or denying contact.

Staffing

 There are currently four Certified Confidential Intermediaries on staff. The CI Program Coordinator carries a 75-80% caseload; one CI carries a 100% caseload; one CI carries a 50% caseload; the Direct Service Coordinator carries a very small caseload.

Electronic Filing

• As of July 1, 2018, petitioners must now electronically file their petitions with the Court to request Intermediary service (rather than mailing the petition to the Court). It does not appear that this change has significantly impacted the number of new appointments received.

Commercial DNA Services

 We have seen an increase in the number of adoptees and birth relatives who have used commercial DNA services in the hopes of connecting to birth relatives and/or learning more about birth family history. We hypothesize that the use of commercial DNA services has impacted the number of new appointments received; however, we do not have direct data to prove or verify this hypothesis.

Fees and Penalties

• No fees or penalties were collected in the first half of the 2022 calendar year.

Other Outcome – any other outcome not included; the petitioner connected to the sought-after relative by other means, the petitioner requested the search end, the petitioner was only seeking medical information and was not interested in a connection, etc.
