This report represents some events the Office of Law Enforcement (OLE) handled over the last couple of weeks; however, it does not include all actions taken by the OLE.

District 1 – Sgt. Tony Petreikis

(Counties: Carroll, Henry, JoDaviess, Lee, Mercer, Ogle, Rock Island, Stephenson & Whiteside)

CARROLL COUNTY

CPO Palumbo issued a Savanna commercial fisherman a citation for failing to submit his record of catch as required.

HENRY COUNTY

CPO Posateri received a disposition involving a Geneseo man who received a citation for dumping a toilet out on the ice of the Rock River. He pled guilty to the charge of pollution of waterway, and he was fined \$120.

JODAVIESS COUNTY

CPO Hoftender assisted with teaching commercial fish enforcement and ginseng enforcement at the IDNR Academy.

LEE COUNTY

CPO Wagner attended Mobile Training Unit classes for standard field sobriety testing and medical marijuana enforcement at the Dixon Police Department.

MERCER COUNTY

ROCK ISLAND COUNTY

CPO Francisko closed out and updated the following cases: 1) A man arrested in 2003 for driving while suspended still has a valid warrant out for his arrest. He failed to appear in court as required. 2) A Chicago resident arrested in 2008 for DUI drugs still has a valid warrant out for his arrest. He failed to appear in court as required. 3) A Davenport, Iowa man arrested in 2015 for OUI still has multiple warrants out for his arrest. He failed to appear in court as required. 4) A Hillsdale man was arrested in 2018 for unlawfully selling aquatic life without a resident retail aquatic life dealer's license pled guilty and paid a \$120 fine. 5) A Rock Island man arrested in 2018 for unlawfully operating his watercraft in

a restricted area above the flooded Steel Dam and operation of a watercraft without the required lanyard/engine cut off switch pled guilty to the lanyard violation. The charge of boat operation in a restricted area was dismissed. The total fine with court fees was \$301. 6) A Milan man arrested in 2018 for hunting without permission of the owner pled guilty to the charge and paid the \$120 fine.

CPO Posateri received dispositions for the following cases: 1) A Colona man appeared in court and pled guilty to the charge of no insurance on his snowmobile. After he showed proof of valid insurance, he paid a fine of \$100; and he received a six-month court supervision. 2) An East Moline man was arrested for OUI pled guilty in court. He was fined \$800 and received a 12-month court supervision. Since he was a first-time offender for OUI and provided a breath sample, there was no suspension of his boating privileges. 3) A Davenport, Iowa man arrested was for OUI and pled guilty in court. He was fined \$1,382 and received a 12-month court supervision. Since he was a first-time offender for OUI and provided a breath sample, there was no suspension of his boating privileges.

STEPHENSON COUNTY

CPOs Beltran and Teas responded to a report of a deceased person at Lake Le-Aqua-Na State Recreation Area. The Illinois State Police division of investigations, Stephenson County Sheriff's Office, and the Lena Police Department responded as well. The case is under investigation.

WHITESIDE COUNTY

CPO Palumbo issued a Morrison man a citation and written warnings for unlawfully taking a white-tailed buck with no either sex deer permit, failing to tag immediately upon kill, and deer hunting with no habitat stamp.

CPO Palumbo issued multiple written warnings to a Rock Falls man for improper tagging of deer and improper reporting of harvest.

While on patrol, CPO Wagner noticed a vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed. A traffic stop was conducted, and the driver was found to be driving on revoked driver's license. The subject was arrested and taken to the Bureau County Jail.

After a short investigation, CPO Wagner cited an individual for shooting at coyotes from a roadway.

DEKALB COUNTY

LASALLE COUNTY

CPO Murry arrested an individual on a warrant related to his investigation of the eight snowmobiles that fled from him in January. The man was taken to the LaSalle County Jail.

While on patrol in Starved Rock State Park, CPO Wagner cited four individuals for entering a restricted area. One subject was also given citation for possession of alcohol in a restricted area. While verifying their identification, one subject was found to be wanted on a warrant. That subject was arrested and transported to the LaSalle County Jail.

While checking fishermen at LaSalle Lake, CPO Wagner observed two individuals fishing; and they had too many sport fishing devices. The subjects were cited for the violations.

CPO Wagner attended a Mobile Training Unit interview and interrogation techniques class at the LaSalle County Sheriff's Department.

Several violations were addressed, and proper enforcement action was taken.

CPO Elliott completed an investigation involving the unlawful take of a deer during the second firearm season. The hunter admitted to killing two does while only possessing one muzzleloader permit. Several violations were addressed, and proper enforcement action was taken.

CASS COUNTY

CPO Wichern charged three commercial fishermen for failing to report their 2018 fishing harvest to the IDNR as required by their Illinois commercial fishing license.

CHRISTIAN COUNTY

CPO Fraser attended advanced roadside impaired driving enforcement training.

CPO Fraser instructed CPO Trainees at the IDNR Academy on a variety of topics to include ATV and OHV law. He also assisted with scenario-based training at the Academy.

CPO Fraser gave a presentation at a hunter safety course.

CPO Wichern issued two fishermen citations for the unlawful possession of three undersized crappie. In a separate incident, CPO Wichern issued two fishermen citations for the unlawful possession of two undersized crappie and one undersized largemouth bass.

LOGAN COUNTY

CPO Wichern charged one commercial fisherman for failing to report his 2018 fishing harvest to the IDNR as required by his Illinois commercial fishing license.

MASON COUNTY

CPO Wichern charged two commercial fishermen for failing to report their 2018 fishing harvest to the IDNR as required by their Illinois commercial fishing license.

MENARD COUNTY

SANGAMON COUNTY

While conducting boat safety inspections, CPO Macias found a few minor infractions; and written warnings were issued.

CPO Wichern charged three commercial fishermen for failing to report their 2018 fishing harvest to the IDNR as required by their Illinois commercial fishing license.

SCOTT COUNTY

CPOs Blakeley and Wichern received a disposition in a case involving a commercial fisherman. The fisherman was found guilty in Scott County Court for failing to check his hoop net for over 144 hours. This will result in his loss of any state commercial fishing contracts for a period of one year.

District 2 – Sgt. Eric Schreiber (Counties: Kane, Lake & McHenry)

KANE COUNTY

CPO Winters met with a subject who harvested a deer without a hunting license. After interviewing the apologetic subject, it appeared to be an accidental oversight, as the subject was relatively new to hunting. Written warnings were issued, and the subject was advised to check his paperwork more carefully.

LAKE COUNTY

CPO Kelley interviewed an individual who may have damaged property with a snowmobile. The case is ongoing.

MCHENRY COUNTY

CPO Kelley responded to call of an injured/sick deer. The deer was located, and the District Wildlife Biologist was notified. In the opinion of the biologist, the deer exhibited a classic case of chronic wasting disease. The deer was collected so a sample could be sent off to confirm the diagnosis.

District 3 – Sgt. Dave Wollgast
(Counties: Grundy, Kankakee, Kendall & Will)

GRUNDY COUNTY

No activity reported for this county.

KANKAKEE COUNTY

CPO Farber investigated a timber theft. Thirteen trees were unlawfully harvested from property owned by The Nature Conservancy. A suspect was located and interviewed. After a brief interview, the subject admitted to unlawfully cutting the trees without permission. The violator was charged and issued a mandatory court date.

CPO Farber located a subject fishing without a license. The subject was also found to have a warrant in Grundy County for failure to appear. The wanted subject was arrested and transported to the Grundy County Jail.

KENDALL COUNTY

CPO Bergland assisted the Oswego Police Department with a drunk and disorderly subject at a local restaurant. The subject was arrested on multiple charges.

CPO Bergland responded to calls involving nuisance animals, boat registrations, and boat titling issues.

CPO Bergland observed a couple fishing on the fishing pier at Loon Lake. The Lake was posted closed to fishing because it had just been stocked with trout for the spring trout season. They both said that they did not see the sign, and it was discovered that neither one had a fishing license. Citations and warnings were issued.

WILL COUNTY

While attempting to conduct a field interview with a subject about possible permit violations, CPO Honiotes was approached by a neighbor who identified himself as the subject's father-in-law. When asked about his hunting season, the father-in-law stated that he had shot a small antlerless buck. A check of the records system revealed that he failed to report the harvest. The subsequent interview with the initial subject revealed the family's hunting habits involved taking multiple deer using each other's tags. The investigation is ongoing.

CPO Reid responded to a complaint of individuals trespassing on private property. Two individuals were discovered collecting shed antlers from private property without the permission of the owner. Enforcement action was taken for the removal of shed antlers from private property without permission.

CPO Reid discovered three individuals who were trespassing and fishing on private property without permission. The individuals accessed the water through a small hole cut in a fence. None of the individuals had a valid fishing license, and two of them provided false birthdays in a failed attempt to avoid citations. All individuals were cited for fishing on private property without permission and no fishing license.

District 4 – Sgt. Joshua Mooi

COOK COUNTY

During a patrol at William W. Powers State Recreation Area, CPO Stanbary completed two vessel inspections. He also issued a written warning to a park visitor for unlawful possession of alcohol in a prohibited area and a written warning to a fisherman for no license in possession.

CPO Stanbary conducted two vessel inspections at Calumet Harbor on Lake Michigan. A written warning was issued for an equipment violation.

While on patrol, CPO Stanbary issued a motorist a written warning for passing on the shoulder of the of the roadway.

CPO Stanbary initiated a traffic stop when a motorist was observed unlawfully using an electronic communication device. During the stop, he detected an odor of cannabis coming from inside the vehicle. When questioned, the driver acknowledged possessing a small amount of cannabis in the glove box. The cannabis was seized, and a subsequent vehicle search turned up no additional contraband. The driver was issued a civil cannabis violation and two written warnings for traffic violations.

A fisherman was issued a citation after CPO Stanbary found him fishing in a restricted area with no valid sport fishing license.

CPO Stanbary issued warnings to fishermen when they were found fishing with no valid sport fishing licenses in possession.

While conducting fishing compliance checks, CPO Klemme issued a citation to an individual who had not purchased a fishing license.

CPO Klemme continues to enforce the no deer feeding regulations in several areas, and several written warnings have been issued.

CPO Klemme attended court and received a disposition in a boating case. The subject pled guilty to failure to transfer title and paid a \$200 donation to the CPO Fund.

CPO Klemme continues to work on several administrative deer investigations.

CPO Sanford observed a vehicle unlawfully passing a line of stopped vehicles in the turn lane. He conducted a traffic stop, and the driver was issued a citation for improper lane usage.

CPO Sanford completed mandatory cyber security training.

CPO Sanford continued to investigate multiple incidents of possible landowner permit fraud.

While on patrol, CPO Sanford observed two individuals fishing from the shoreline and conducted a fishing compliance check. One of the individuals was fishing without a valid Illinois sportfishing license, and a citation was issued for the violation.

CPO Sanford attended Cook County Court in conjunction with a multi-year deer hunting investigation. In total, four defendants pled guilty to numerous counts of unlawful hunting activity, including multiple counts of unlawful take of white-tailed deer, as well as multiple counts of unlawful hunting white-tailed deer by use/aid of bait. The four defendants paid fines, fees, and restitution totaling \$2,096. The defendants were also ordered to forfeit four white-tailed deer racks that were awarded to the IDNR.

DUPAGE COUNTY

CPO Stanbary completed a permit investigation involving a DuPage County resident who was reported to be unlawfully attempting to obtain a free landowner permit. It was determined that the individual misunderstood the eligibility requirements upon applying. A written warning was issued to the applicant.

CLARK COUNTY

CPO Wellum received a complaint of an intoxicated subject at the rest area on I-70. He located the subject who was in physical control of his vehicle, and the subject was under the influence of alcohol. He also located a loaded firearm and 32.5 grams of cannabis in the vehicle. The subject was issued citations for driving under the influence of alcohol, driving with blood alcohol concentration over .08, possession of cannabis greater than 30 grams but less than 100 grams, and aggravated unlawful use of a loaded firearm.

CPO Wellum stopped a timber truck and completed a timber motor carrier inspection. No violations were found.

CPO Wellum was the keynote speaker at a meeting of the Optimist Club in Marshall.

CPO Wellum was the first responder to a two-car accident. He called for two ambulances for the injured people, the Fire Department to put out a fire, and EnerStar Electric Cooperative to replace a power pole which had been sheared during the accident.

CPO Wellum conducted a traffic stop and issued the driver a citation for speeding.

BOND COUNTY

CLINTON COUNTY

CPO Tapley attended a hunter safety course. There were 48 students in attendance.

CPO Tapley stopped three UTVs on the roadway, and one driver was found to have an open beer. One citation and three written warnings were issued.

CPO Tapley issued three separate commercial fishermen citations for failing to submit their records as required.

CPO Tapley finished a deer investigation resulting in one citation being issued.

MADISON COUNTY

While conducting a commercial fishing detail, CPOs Schachner and Sievers received several citizen complaints of illegal commercial nets containing dead fish at Horseshoe Lake. They located and removed a considerable length of gill net. The net did not have device tags, and there was no name and address as required. There were many fish in the net; and most of the fish were dead. CPO Schachner returned the following day with CPO Tapley to remove the remaining netting and fish. In all, nearly one-half mile of gill net was removed. The net contained 410 fish with an estimated weight of 8,196 pounds. Of note, there were 11 giant flathead catfish with an average weight over 40 pounds each and two dead diving ducks in the net. The nets were illegally unattended (dead-set) for eight consecutive days. Further investigation resulted in identifying the suspected commercial fisherman, and he admitted that the nets were his. The commercial fisherman and his worker admitted that the nets had been in the water for approximately one week. The commercial fisherman responsible for the gill nets was cited for 21 violations, and his assistant received a citation as an accessory. The gill net was also seized.

ST. CLAIR COUNTY

CPO Ray taught a water survival class to the recruits currently in the IDNR Academy, Class 19-25. All recruits were put through rigorous testing to ensure they could survive in the water throughout the course of their duties as CPOs. CPO Ray, along with other instructors from throughout the state, tested the recruits with simple tasks of swimming in uniform and updated the challenge with underwater obstacle courses and physical combative subjects.

CPO Jourdan gave a presentation at Rend Lake College to Jefferson County 8th grade 4-H students. He discussed the job duties of a CPO, hunting and boating safety, and the importance of further education.

CPO Jourdan spoke at a hunter safety class at Rend Lake Marketplace.

CPO Jourdan initiated an investigation on multiple suspects falsely claiming residency to obtain free landowner deer permits. It was confirmed that the applicants did not reside with the landowner, and charges are pending.

CPOs Folden and Haggerty investigated a deer complaint in which the suspect unlawfully harvested a deer in Jefferson County during a closed season. The hunter self-reported the violation when he realized Jefferson County did not have a late winter deer season and after he had reported his harvest. When investigating the matter, the CPOs found that the hunter did not have a permit when he was hunting during the closed season, and he reported the harvested deer using his son's deer permit. Two citations and one written warning were issued. The citations were for hunting during a closed season and hunting without a valid deer permit. The written warning was for unlawfully using a permit belonging to another person.

CPO Haggerty is investigating a timber complaint.

SALINE COUNTY

While patrolling IDNR property, CPO Folden heard Saline County dispatchers send officers to a call of a man with a gun. CPO Folden responded to assist. When the officers arrived, they confirmed that the man was armed. After discussing the matter, officers confirmed that a juvenile had called a neighbor because there was an unidentified car in his driveway. The neighbor (a lawful gun owner) responded with his firearms to investigate the complaint. The occupants of the unidentified vehicle were at the residence to pick up a child from a birthday party and had simply arrived early. No enforcement action was taken.

A fishing compliance check and boat safety inspection was conducted. One of the two did not have a valid sport fish license. One citation was issued to the boat operator for lack of wearable life jackets, and a written warning was issued to the person without a fishing license.

CPO Buhnerkempe issued a citation to a commercial fisherman for failure to submit annual catch reports.

JASPER COUNTY

CPO Roper received information of a commercial fisherman who had failed to submit required harvest information. The fisherman was issued a citation for failure to submit records when required.

CPO D. Taylor observed a subject using a 150 HP motor on Newton Lake. The Lake is posted as a 25 HP or smaller motor size. A citation was issued for the violation. In a separate incident, CPO D. Taylor conducted a fishing compliance check on Newton Lake. The Indiana resident was using an Illinois resident fishing license and was in possession of a 12-inch largemouth bass. The largemouth bass size limit on Newton Lake is 18 inches. One citation and one written warning were issued.

CPO Johnson investigated two subjects regarding deer hunting violations. One of the subjects purchased a deer permit prior to taking a deer but reported the harvest on another permit. He was issued a written warning.
