ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEWS COMPLETED

Project reviews completed from November 16 to December 15 are listed below. These projects have been screened through the internal environmental review process for potential impacts on wetlands, threatened and endangered species, and cultural and archaeological resources, etc. Through the review process it was determined that environmental impacts have been kept to a minimum and mitigated as necessary, that they do not meet the criteria for significant actions as defined in the environmental review process, and may proceed. All these projects are in compliance with the Endangered Species Protection Act, Natural Areas Preservation Act, Interagency Wetlands Policy Act and cultural resource statutes.

- **Kickapoo State Park**

2004224—This project will install a new sewer expansion line in the campground. Project originally submitted for review on 11-15-2019.

- **Horseshoe Lake State Fish & Wildlife Area**

2003057—This project will repair a failed culvert and water control structure. Project originally submitted for review on 09-23-2019.

- **Cache River State Fish & Wildlife Area**

2004253—This stewardship project will repair seepage and gully problems threatening the native swamp communities and associated species at Heron Pond. Project originally submitted for review on 11-15-2019.

- **Fort de Chartres State Historic Site**

1910857—This project proposes to remove and reconstruct part of the existing banquette wall. Project originally submitted for review on 05-13-2019.

- **Shelbyville State Fish & Wildlife Area**

2002776—This project proposes to improve canoe and kayak access to the Kaskaskia River at Denham Pit. Project originally submitted for review on 09-12-2019.

- **Mazonia-Braidwood State Fish & Wildlife Area**

2004481—This project will clear non-native and invasive brush species along two drainage ditches. Project

originally submitted for review on 11-22-2019.

- **Lake Murphysboro State Park**

2004492—This project will replace dilapidated wooden bridges on the Walk Away hiking trail. Project originally submitted for review on 11-25-2019.

- **Dixon Springs State Park**

2004482—This project will demolish two abandoned and dilapidated church buildings at the park. Project originally submitted for review on 11-22-2019.

- **Illinois Beach State Park**

1912417—This project proposes to replace the roof of the nature center. Project originally submitted for review on 06-27-2019.

- **Giant City State Park**

2004733—This project will have a pesticide storage building installed within the maintenance compound. Project originally submitted for review on 12-09-2019.

- **Trail of Tears State Forest**

2004725—This project will replace 20 separate wood privies throughout the site. Project originally submitted for review on 12-09-2019.

- **Cahokia Mounds State Historic Site**

2004749—This project will install an interpretive sign for the archaeological mitigation patio. Project originally submitted for review on 12-10-2019.
