Giant City State Park Shelter Information

Giant City State Park has five shelters available for use, at various locations throughout the site. Each shelter may be reserved for a \$25 fee (non-refundable) through ReserveAmerica.com. Each shelter offers a nearby privie, a family sized charcoal grill and picnic tables.

Other key amenities include:

- Shelter #1 – Located at the north end of the park, along Stonefort Rd.
 - There is no electric or water available at this site.
 - Large, open air timber structure, comfortably accommodating 100 people.
 - Rock climbing and rappelling options are available at the adjacent sandstone bluff.

Shelter #2 – Located along Giant City Lodge Rd.

- Conveniently located near the Giant City Nature Trail and the Devil's Standtable Trail.
- This is a CCC era stone and timber structure, with two fireplaces, which can accommodate up to 30 people.
- A playground, electricity and potable water are available.

Shelter #3 – Located along Giant City Lodge Rd.

- Conveniently located near the Giant City Nature Trail
- Large, open air timber structure, comfortably accommodating 100 people.
- A playground, electricity and potable water are available.

Shelter #4 – Located at the intersection of Giant City Rd. and Church St.

- Modern era, open air pavilion, capable of handling 50 people comfortably.
- A playground and potable water are available but NO ELECTRICITY.

Shelter #5 – Located at the intersection of Giant City Rd. and Giant City Lodge Rd.

- Modern era, open air pavilion, capable of handling 50 people comfortably.
- Post Oak Trail may be accessed nearby, and a large green space, with a ballfield is located nearby.
- A playground and potable water are available but NO ELECTRICITY.
