The Little Wabash Audubon Society received a \$1,000.00 grant from the Illinois Wildlife Preservation Fund in FY 04. The funding was to be used to host a 2-day environmental education event. The project has been completed and we are now requesting the funding payment. Attached you will find the final report, photo documentation, and budget report.

Final Report

Last year the Little Wabash Audubon Society developed and hosted a 2-day natural resources education event titled "Outdoor Days". This event addressed the need for environmental education in the area and was well attended. With grant funding from the Wildlife Preservation Fund the event was held again this year.

With the cooperation of conservation organizations and the Ballard Nature Center, the event took place at the nature center September 27th and 28th. Programs and activities took place throughout the day covering many natural resources subjects (see the attached schedule of events). High quality presenters educated the public on birds of prey, wetlands, songbirds, herps and more. Children and adults were able to participate in many hands-on activities. This event provided individuals and families an opportunity to learn about the areas natural resources and how to identify, manage, and appreciate them. Several hundred people participated in the event.

The grant funds were used toward paying presenters and purchasing materials for various activities. The Illinois Raptor Center received \$506.80, John Wallace received \$200.00 for storytelling, Tom May received \$269.00 for birdhouse and feeder workshops, and \$19.00 was used to purchase supplies for the children's nature craft activities.

The Ballard Nature Center would like to thank the Illinois Wildlife Preservation for providing funding to assist with this event.

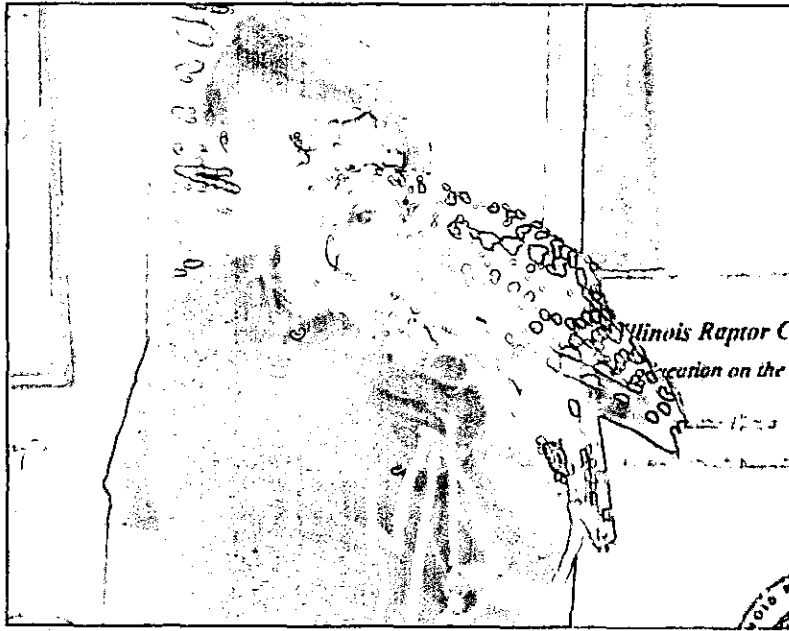
