

SUMMARY OF 2009-2010 ILLINOIS DEER SEASONS

General Information

Season Dates:

Archery Season – October 1, 2009 through January 17, 2010, closed during firearm deer season in counties open to firearm deer hunting

Youth Season - October 10-11, 2009

Firearm Season - November 20-22; December 3-6, 2009

Muzzleloader Season – December 11-13, 2009 (also allowed December 3-6)

Late-Winter Antlerless Season/CWD Season - Dec. 31, 2009 - Jan. 3, 2010; Jan. 15-17, 2010

Total Days of Deer Hunting: 109

Bag Limit: One deer per legal permit, with no set limit for total number of deer allowed. No more than 2 antlered deer during the year, except additional antlered deer may be taken during the special CWD season only.

Significant Changes: The length of the late-winter antlerless season and the special CWD season was increased from 3 days to 7 days. Because of the increased season length, check stations were discontinued for the special CWD season, and successful hunters began using the automated harvest reporting system. Archery season was extended statewide through the end of the late-winter season dates, essentially adding 3 more days. Youth and late-winter season permits were sold OTC, and any firearm and muzzleloader season permits remaining after the lottery drawings were made available OTC until the close of those seasons.

Harvest Reporting: Successful deer hunters were required to register their harvest by 10 p.m. on the same calendar day as the deer was taken by using an automated harvest reporting system (telephone or internet). The only exception to automated harvest reporting occurred in select northern Illinois counties during the firearm deer season, where mandatory check stations were staffed by IDNR biologists to collect tissue samples for CWD surveillance.





Length: 109 days (102 days in counties open to firearm deer hunting)

Number of Counties Open: 102

Special Regulations: Resident combination permits (one either-sex and one antlerless-only tag) available over-the-counter (OTC) in unlimited quantities. Nonresident combination permits were limited to a quota of 25,000 and issued via lottery. Single antlerless-only permits were available to both resident and nonresident hunters OTC without limit.



Length: 7 days (split; one 3-day [Fri-Sun] + one 4-day [Thu-Sun] segment)

Number of Counties Open: 99 (closed in Cook, DuPage, Lake)

Special Regulations: County-specific (or special hunt area-specific) permits issued via lotteries; unallocated permits subsequently available OTC through end of season. Mandatory check stations in effect for 9 northern Illinois counties (Stephenson, Winnebago, Boone, McHenry, Ogle, DeKalb, Kane, LaSalle, and Grundy) for chronic wasting disease (CWD) surveillance; other counties used automated harvest reporting.

Weather Conditions: Warm first season, with temperatures 4-6 degrees above normal (lows in the 30s; highs 50-60). Second season temperatures somewhat below normal (2-8 degrees from north to south), with heavy rain in southern Illinois on the first day.

Corn Harvest: Only 60% harvested by the beginning of the season

Deer Harvest: 99,755

Season Record: 123,792 (2005)

Harvest Sex Ratio: 55.0% male: 45.0% female (42.0% antlered: 58.0% antlerless)



2009 Youth Deer Season Results

Length: 2 days

Number of Counties Open: 99 (closed in Cook, DuPage, and Lake counties)

Special Regulations: Participation limited to youths under the age of 16, and hunters must be accompanied by a responsible supervising adult. One county-specific either-sex permit (available OTC for the first time) or one special hunt area permit (issued via lottery) allowed per hunter. This was the third year in which the season was open statewide and in which either-sex hunting was permitted.





Length: 3 days

Number of Counties Open: 99 (closed in Cook, DuPage, Lake)


Special Regulations: County-specific (or special hunt area-specific) permits issued via lotteries; unallocated permits subsequently available OTC through end of season. Hunters with muzzleloader permits were also allowed to hunt with a muzzleloader during the 2nd Firearm Deer Season (4 days). Recipients of landowner permits (for their own property only) valid during the Firearm Deer Season could use those unfilled permits during the Muzzleloader Deer Season so long as they used a muzzleloading rifle.



Length: 7 days (added 4 days - Thursday through Sunday after Christmas)

Number of Counties Open: 70 (75 in previous year)


Special Regulations: Legal weapons were shotguns, muzzleloaders, or handguns. County-specific antlerless-only permits available OTC from license vendors (limit 1 in most counties; unlimited availability in the counties most significantly above goal). Hunters with unfilled permits for the Firearm, Muzzleloader, or Youth deer seasons were allowed to hunt the Late Winter Deer Season to harvest antlerless deer, so long as the permit was issued for an open county. Persons with an unfilled Muzzleloader Season permit must use a muzzleloading rifle.



2009-2010 Special CWD Deer Season Results

Length: 7 days (concurrent with Late-Winter Season)

Number of Counties Open: 5 (Boone, Winnebago, McHenry, DeKalb, Kane)

Special Regulations: Legal weapons were shotguns, muzzleloaders, or handguns. County-specific antlerless-only permits available OTC without limit to residents and nonresidents. Unfilled firearm, muzzleloader, and youth permits valid for open counties may be used during this season as long as the hunter uses only the weapon(s) allowed by that permit, and only harvests the sex of deer allowed by that permit. The limit of 2 antlered deer was waived during this season.

Harvest: 472

Season Record: 874 (Jan. 2007)

Harvest Sex Ratio: 33.9% male: 66.1% female (14.4% antlered: 85.6% antlerless)

Harvest Age/Sex Summary (All Seasons)

At mandatory check stations, age and sex of harvested deer were recorded by IDNR wildlife biologists. For all other deer reported via the automated harvest reporting system, deer were placed into age classes based on morphological data reported by the hunter. Age classes were female adult (≥1.5 years), female fawn, male adult (≥2.5 years), male yearling (1.5 years), and male fawn.
