**OBJECTIVE** – Provide a quality service to Illinois State Parks, with visitors and to encourage compliance with park rules and regulations.

**RESPONSIBILITIES TO BE PERFORMED BY VOLUNTEER** – Be on duty an average of 35 hours per week including holidays and weekends; represent the Department of Natural Resources with knowledge of rules and regulations; serve as an informational source to the public with respect to the park, activities within the park and community attractions; greet visitors, help them get settled, answer questions, receive comments, pass out literature; collect camping fees; promote care of park and stress keeping a clean campsite; watch for activities or conditions in the park which require immediate attention of the site staff and contact help in emergency situation; perform minor maintenance tasks such as letter pickup and checking restrooms.

**PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS** – Minimum stay of four weeks, although hosts may stay longer if desired; hosts should be available to assist park visitors 35 hours per week; required to have own camping equipment; must be 21 years of age or older.

**TRAINING AND PREPARATION** – Orientation to the site will be provided, including explanation of rules and regulations, emergency procedures, general information, and campground fee collections. Specific training will occur for the above responsibilities and for any additional activities that may arise during volunteer activities at the site as determined by the IDNR Supervisor. Depending on Volunteer interest, some research on the site may be necessary.

TO: Director, Illinois State Police

I further authorize any agency, board or commission which maintains records relating to me to provide same on request to the Illinois State Police for the purpose of this investigation.

I certify that the Illinois State Police, and its officers or employees/contractors/agents who furnish this information concerning me, and any agency, board or commission and its officers and employees which provide these records to the Illinois State Police, shall not be held accountable for giving this information. I do hereby release and save harmless the Illinois State Police, its officers and employees/contractors/agents, and any other agency, board or commission and its officers and employees which provide records concerning me for the purpose of this investigation, from any and all liability which may be incurred as a result of releasing such information.

If criminal history background checks are conducted, unless otherwise specified under statute or administrative rule, the Illinois State Police statutory and administrative procedures for conducting Uniform Conviction Information Act (UCIA), [20 ILCS 2635/1, et seq.] checks shall be followed. The criminal history transcripts can be included as part of a nexus review. The applicant shall be provided a copy of his/her criminal background check. The applicant has the obligation and responsibility to notify the hiring agency and the Illinois State Police Bureau of Identification within seven (7) business days if the information is inaccurate or incomplete. The hiring agency shall notify the applicant should he/she be disqualified for a specific position applied for due to his/her past criminal convictions.

It is incumbent upon the applicant to ensure his/her criminal history information is accurate and up-to-date at all times. Errors in criminal history transcripts and/or delays in challenging or correcting record information shall not be construed as sufficient justification to delay the hiring process. A candidate who has provided notice that his criminal history information is incorrect may be by-passed by the hiring agency in favor of another candidate.

An agency, board or commission shall refuse to consider further any candidate who refuses to complete and sign the Authorization for Release of Criminal History Information form.

An electronic transmittal or photocopy of this release form will be valid as an original thereof, even though said document does not contain an original writing of my signature.

INTERNAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR HIRING AGENCY

This form must be accompanied by either the UCIA Name Inquiry form (Form ISP 6-405B) or the UCIA Fingerprint Inquiry form (Form ISP 6-404B) and is to be completed by the hiring agency. These ISP forms provide Principal Requester Contact Information and Category of Inquiries Information. These forms may only be ordered from the ISP home page (<http://www.isp.state.il.us/>) and selecting the Criminal History link on the left side under Agency Links or by calling ISP Bureau of Identification at 815/740-5160 between 8:00 a.m. & 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The name check process can be performed electronically and details are provided at: <http://www.isp.state.il.us/crimhistory/convictioninquiries.cfm>. The UCIA fingerprint form can be ordered and then taken to a local law enforcement agency for fingerprinting or the individual applicant may contact one of ISP's licensed live scan fingerprint vendors listed at: <https://www.idfpr.com/LicenseLookUp/fingerprintlist.asp>. Each form may only be used once and cannot be copied or duplicated as each form contains a unique Transaction Control Number used for internal ISP tracking purposes.

The Illinois Uniform Conviction Information Act, 20 ILCS 2635/13, provides that results pursuant to this criminal background check should only be relied upon for 30 days. As such, this background check is not limited to a specific position and may be secondarily disseminated for a period of 30 days and is not limited to a single reason for inquiry. Each executed Authorization for Release of Criminal History Information must be maintained on file for at least 2 years pursuant to 20 ILCS 2635/7.

Upon receipt of the criminal history record information, the hiring agency, board or commission shall provide a copy to the candidate and notify him/her that he/she has the obligation and responsibility to notify the hiring agency within seven (7) days if the information is inaccurate or incomplete.



### CANCELLATION INSTRUCTIONS

When entered in the payee's record with the program agency, this authorization will remain in effect until canceled by notice to the program agency by the payee or in the event of death of the payee or the beneficiary of this payment. The financial institution should also be notified if the payee cancels this agreement. The financial institution may cancel their agreement by providing the payee with a written notice 30 days in advance of the cancellation date. The payee must advise the program agency immediately if this authorization is cancelled. The financial institution cannot cancel this authorization by advice to the program agency.

#### **Privacy Act Notice:**

*You previously provided your Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN), i.e. your social security number or your employer identification number, to the State of Illinois upon becoming a State of Illinois payee. Section 6109 of the Internal Revenue Code requires you to give your correct TIN to persons, such as the State of Illinois Office of the Comptroller, who must file documents with the Internal Revenue Service to report income paid to you, the acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, or contributions you made to an IRA. 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### DIRECT DEPOSIT OF PAYCHECK

Public Act 97-0348 requires all State payment for a State employee's payroll **must be made through direct deposit.** There is an exemption from this direct deposit mandate for State employees covered by provisions in collective bargaining agreements that do not require direct deposit of paychecks. There is also a hardship petition available for download on the Comptroller's website. **The Office of the Comptroller requires that \$2.50 per check be deducted for those not participating in Direct Deposit.**

When completing the Authorization for Deposit of Recurring Payments form, please ensure that the routing and account numbers are accurate. Any errors on this form will cause the paycheck to be returned to the Office of the Comptroller.

Once an employee submits the **Authorization for Deposit of Recurring Payments** form to Payroll, it will take **one full pay period** to process the direct deposits. Therefore, **an employee's first payroll check will be a paper check mailed from DNR Headquarters.** These checks are generally received and mailed 2 days before the regularly scheduled pay date. Comptroller's regulations require us to allow **30 business days** to deliver before we can initiate a stop payment, so please allow sufficient time before contacting Payroll.

**If you move,** you must provide 3 W-4 cards to Payroll as soon as you know your new address. We are not allowed to make address changes via email or phone. Again if you receive a paper check and it is mailed to an incorrect address, we are required to wait **30 business days** before initiating a stop payment.

**If you change banks or accounts,** you must provide an updated Authorization for Deposit of Recurring Payments form to the Payroll Office. Generally, the Office of the Comptroller will require the issuance of a paper check for the first payroll check issued after this change.



# **ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES MISSION STATEMENT**

Our mission is to manage, protect and sustain Illinois' natural and cultural resources; provide resource-compatible recreational opportunities; and promote natural resource-related public safety, education and science.

## **PURPOSE OF HANDBOOK**

- To help hosts maintain the excellent level of service currently being provided for visitors.
- To assist in training new volunteers to be hosts.
- To serve as a handy reference for information on hosting.
- To help insure a safe, satisfying volunteer experience for hosts.
- To assist hosts in selecting the type of service and duty most appropriate for them.

# HOST DUTIES

Campground hosts serve as public relations liaisons providing information, assisting with camping permits and performing other assorted functions.

Hosting opportunities will vary from location-to-location, depending on the need for volunteers. Assignments may last from one to six months. Alternate Campground Hosts are needed. There are times when we have last minute cancellations, and it's helpful to have alternates on file to contact individuals who are available on short notice. Additionally, alternate hosts are used as a temporary replacement of the regular hosts. For example, the regular hosts may need to take a short leave of absence. An alternate host is contacted to fill in during the time the regular host is gone.

The following is a list of what is expected of you. Please be sure to ask enough questions to thoroughly understand the scope and details of your duties.

## GENERAL EXPECTATIONS OF HOSTS

### *Volunteer and live in the campground.*

All hosts will be given a free campsite but need to provide their own camping equipment in return for services provided. Volunteers will have a "Host" sign at their site.

### *Welcome campers in a cheerful and helpful manner.*

Greet campers with a smile. Be prepared with all forms when the campers appear. This will make the check in quicker and help put the camper at ease.

### *Collect camping fees.*

### *Acquaint visitors with the park layout and surrounding area.*

Brochures are available at the park office which provides a map, history and activities available at the park.

### *Become familiar with points of interest and locations where local services can be obtained.*

Knowing the locations of the nearest grocery store, restaurant, church, bait shop and gas station is very helpful to campers.

*Have information for campers such as weather forecast, where fishing and hunting is good, park restrictions, alcohol restrictions (if applicable) and the time for quiet hours.*

*Set a good example by maintaining a neat and orderly campsite.*

Remember, you are a representative of the Illinois Department of Natural Resources, please try to keep your appearance neat and campsite clean.

*Report necessary repairs and maintenance to park staff.*

If you are aware that maintenance work needs to be done in a specific area tell the park staff. Being extra eyes for the staff is very beneficial and helpful to them. Some examples may include: shower building repairs, fire rings need replaced, weeds or trees need to be removed; pads for the campsite need gravel, etc.

*Assist with special programs and campground activities.*

If you are interested in doing programs at the campsite, work with the seasonal interpreter (if there is one), or organize your own program. These do not have to be complicated and limit them to 30-40 min. Advertise ahead of time. Some examples might be: leaf rubbing for children, story-telling, talks or seminars about fishing, trees, animals; wildflower hikes; horseshoe tournament, volleyball tournament. Posters and materials are available through the Departments clearinghouse (217) 782-7498.

*Other duties as assigned..*

Hosts may be asked to do additional duties as needed.

## **VOLUNTEER SCHEDULE**

All hosts have specific duties and scheduled times to volunteer which are determined by the site.

Hosts must agree to volunteer 35 hours per week including holidays and weekends.

Hosts normally stay a minimum of 4 weeks.

Hosts will be paid the \$1.00 a day rate on a contractual voucher and hosts are paid only for actual days worked.

## COLLECTING CAMPING FEES

A primary duty of a campground host is to collect camping fees. Keep in mind camping fees are different for each class site. Make sure you are familiar with the camping fee schedule. This information will be provided to you once you begin your volunteer service or at the campground host training.

### *Important information to remember...*

Make sure you tell the campers to read the back of the permit. It explains the rules, and that they are responsible for that information.

You MUST indicate when someone pays by check by putting the driver's license number on the camping permit. Otherwise, they could come back for a refund and receive cash back on a bad check.

The camper must be an Illinois resident to receive any discounts. Seniors 62 or older will be charged one-half the established camping fee on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday, at Class A and B sites but must pay the entire established camping fee on all sites on any Friday, Saturday or Sunday.

Review regulations on disabilities. The camper must have the number "2" following the disability letter in order to qualify for the discount.

An Illinois resident who is a disabled veteran or former prisoner of war may camp without being charged a camping fee, but if at a site with utilities, must pay the entire utility fee for each day of camping. Appropriate documentation from the Illinois Department of Veteran Affairs must be presented to qualify.

# FORMS

New campground hosts must fill out a Campground Host Application. Your application will be kept on file at the park and in the Springfield office. Applicants for campground host positions must be at least 21 years old and have a valid driver's license.

The form that returning hosts must fill out is the Campground Host Application. Hosts will need to sign a vehicle authorization form if you will be driving a state vehicle.

## **FORMS MUST BE FILLED OUT ON AN ANNUAL BASIS!**

The Campground Host Coordinator must have updated forms on file each year.

# SECURITY ISSUES

## *THOUGHTS FROM YOUR CPO:*

A Conservation Police Officer (CPO) is available in the district in which the park is located. Ask the staff at the park who your CPO is and introduce yourself to him or her.

## **IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER...**

Keep a list of emergency telephone & radio numbers.

Be aware of the "chain of command". Know who you should call first, second, etc. during an incident or emergency.

If you are calling for a CPO and they do not respond it is probably because they are out of their vehicle and they must be on the State Police band. They are not ignoring you. Unless it is an emergency, wait and try to call them back a little later. In case of life threatening emergency, contact Park Staff first or call 911.

When dialing 911- use a hard line (regular phone). Cellular phones do not work as well - the call may take longer if you use a cell phone.

Inform campers of the alcohol ban, if one exists, within the campground. If anyone is drinking in an alcohol-free campground take note of it and contact the park staff. A CPO will be notified and will confiscate all alcohol in their possession.

Juveniles need to be under supervision in campground during the 10pm - 7am quiet hours.

Do not take law enforcement issues into your own hands - leave it to the CPO or the Site Security Officer. The best thing for you to do is be a good witness. Take notes on vehicle color, license plates, campsite number, and physical descriptions, so you do not forget the information. If you suspect illegal behavior, you should take notes and contact your CPO as soon as possible.

# TIPS FOR CAMPGROUND HOSTS

- Leave notice at your site when you leave. This will help campers know what to do.
- Talk with campers to discuss any concerns they may have, and distribute the visitor survey forms
- Be aware of local events such as festivals, tournaments, etc.
- Always keep lines of communication open among you, the campers and the site staff.
- You must know the rules of the park and follow them. People are always watching what you do, so your activities are important.
- You should maintain a relationship with the concessionaire. You will be able to better inform campers of what is available to them at the concession.
- You can't always resolve problems - just always follow the rules. If you don't know an answer asks the staff to help you.

## Phone Etiquette

At times, hosts will be responsible for answering the phones at the parks, for example hosts at Rock Cut State Park are to answer the phone in the registration booth. It is important that they are aware on how to properly handle phone calls. Ask the staff at the park at which you are hosting for information on phone etiquette.

## Camping Fees 2017

For your information, in parenthesis, the first fee listed is the initial camping fee, the second fee listed is the utility fee. Discounts equal 1/2 the applicable camping fee + the \$10 utility fee except for Class C & D where no fee is charged. Cabins rent for \$25 + applicable camping and utility fees. Discounts apply to Illinois residents only.

## Cabins Fees:

- The Rent-a-Camp fee for cabins is in addition to the camping and utility fees. Fees must be paid in full at the time the reservation is made. The \$5.00 reservation fee is non-refundable. The primitive, two-room cabins are equipped with only the bare essentials: one full-sized bed with mattress, two sets of bunk beds with mattresses, an electric heater, a drop-leaf table with chairs, and ceiling fans. Many cabins are handicapped accessible and can be approached via vehicle. Showers, electricity, charcoal grills and picnic tables are available at the campgrounds; however, campers must bring their own bed linens and personal items. Dogs and other pets are not allowed at cabin sites. \*Note: 'Siloam Springs' cabin rents for the large tent fee.
