
CWD has and continues to be detected in this county. CWD seasons allow for extra hunter harvest to reduce

deer density and disease transmission.


Number tested for CWD 2019-2020: 388

CWD positive deer 2019-2020: 7

IDNR sharpshooting: 25 deer were removed via sharpshooting which is used to supplement hunter harvest, allows localized deer reductions in known CWD positive areas to reduce transmission rates and Recent Archery Harvest by Bow Type environmental contamination. Through these efforts CWD prevalence has remained low (see below).
