

2011 Sticker Shock Activities

Local groups will be placing Project Sticker Shock materials in liquor establishments throughout the state during April – Alcohol Awareness Month. Following is a sampling of upcoming Sticker Shock activities (listed alphabetically by area of activity):

Algonquin. Sgt. Robert Salazar will be conducting their Sticker Shock detail on Fri, April 15, 3:30-8pm in conjunction with the Jacobs Safety Initiative.

Alsip. Police Chief Christopher Radz will be visiting 15 liquor establishments to distribute Sticker Shock materials on Fri, April 1.

Aurora. Led by Breaking Free's Ann McBride, the East Aurora High School Operation Snowball group will be conducting citywide Sticker Shock activities on Sat, April 30.

Bartlett. The Mireya Flores and the Bartlett Police Department's Crime Prevention/Public Services Bureau will distribute Sticker Shock materials to approximately 35 liquor establishments during the week of April 4-8.

Belgium. Police Chief Josh Brown will distribute Sticker Shock materials to Belgium liquor establishments on Fri, April 1.
