*** In December, 2015 IDOC initiated a major IT transition moving from a DOS-based offender tracking system to a modern, web-based tracking system. During the transition, some traditional population counts and other measures were not collected. Therefore, December 2015 data counts are estimates and subject to change. Moving forward, the Department continues to validate certain data measures and all elements are subject to change as more information becomes available.
