**Course Descriptions for Kewanee Life Skills Rehabilitation Center:**

- <sup>1</sup>Course completer is a student who demonstrates mastery of 75% or more of all skill, knowledge, and objectives presented in the course.
- <sup>2</sup>Adult Living approaches life on a practical level. Participants discuss everyday living including relationships, life skills, parenting, problem solving, resource and household management.
- <sup>3</sup>Advance Microsoft Office teaches the basics of Microsoft Access, PowerPoint, and Publisher.
- <sup>4</sup>Communications I teaches students to communicate in informal and formal settings. Communications II focuses on public speaking.
- <sup>5</sup>Computer Concepts introduces the concept and purpose of computer operating systems while providing an overview of functions and practical uses.
- <sup>6</sup>Coping Through Art is presented in conjunction with the Clinical and Mental Health Departments to teach offenders coping skills for difficult emotional experiences.
- <sup>7</sup>Creative Expressions teaches expressive arts for self-examination through creative activities to learn better thought management and feeling expression techniques.
- <sup>8</sup>Financial Literacy I gives an introduction to personal finance and economy. Financial Literacy II is a refresher course for offenders who are close to discharge.
- <sup>9</sup>Interpersoanl Skills examines nine essential interpersonal skills to compare and explore them through the lives of historical figures and stories.
- <sup>10</sup>Keyboarding introduces students to proper use of a keyboard as well as basic grammar.
- <sup>11</sup>Microsoft Excel teaches basic spreadsheet manipulation and applications.
- <sup>12</sup>Microsoft Word teaches the creation of textual documents.
- <sup>13</sup>Obtaining and Maintaining a Job allows students to perfect their written and oral communication skills and learn the professionalism needed to acquire and keep a job.
- <sup>14</sup>Orientation introduces the student to the basics of KLSRC living and develops each students schedule of courses.
- <sup>15</sup>Portfolio teaches how to and the importance of maintaining and organizing personal, educational, and professional documentation.  
Course will be discontinued January 2018 and curriculum will be merged into other courses.
- <sup>16</sup>Practical Math I - IV examines practical, everyday uses of Mathematics, with each level concentrating on different concepts and skills.
- <sup>17</sup>Reading for Entertainment teaches that recreational reading is a positive use of leisure time.
- <sup>18</sup>Re-Entry I & II teach students resources they will utilize during the transition back into society.  
Courses will be discontinued in January 2018 and curriculum will be merged into another course.
- <sup>19</sup>Rules of the Road is a refresher course on Illinois driving laws, regulations, and requirements for a license.
- <sup>20</sup>Service Learning is an experiential course in which offenders engage in activities that address individual and community needs, while having structured opportunities for reflection and practical pre-vocational experiences.
- <sup>21</sup>Wellness teaches the basics of healthy living and eating to develop a personal wellness plan.
- <sup>22</sup>30 Ways to Shine as a New Employee develops skills for success in the workplace.
- <sup>23</sup>Program Completer is a student who completes or demonstrates mastery through previous coursework or life experience, of the following mandatory courses:  
Orientation, Keyboarding, Computer Concepts, Obtaining and Maintaining a Job, Communications I, Interpersonal Skills, and Financial Literacy I.

This population forecast reflects the Department's efforts to improve the method for projecting prison population utilizing a simulation tool that includes past experience and policy changes. Conceptually, the model is designed around the movement of individuals through the prison system. The data reflect Fiscal Year 2017 experience.

The underlying assumptions are:

1. Admissions are trending down but slowing in recent years
2. IDOC implementation of risk assessments to identify needs and target programs to reduce recidivism
3. High potential for legislative changes designed to shorten length of stay for certain offenses
4. Initial truth-in-sentencing offenders will begin to be released
5. Opening of Kewanee Life Skills Reentry Center for enhanced reintegration by offense class.
