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## **ILCC: Updated COVID-19 Mitigation Efforts to Take Effect in Region 1** *Non-compliance may result in liquor license suspension*

CHICAGO— Additional COVID-19 mitigation efforts go into effect October 3, 2020 in Region 1 in response to continued positivity rate averages greater than or equal to 8% for three consecutive days. The Illinois Liquor Control Commission is reminding licensed liquor establishments in Region 1 that failure to abide by the new mitigation efforts could result in immediate enforcement action against their license. Region 1 is a ten-county region including Jo Daviess, Stephenson, Winnebago, Boone, Dekalb, Carrol, Ogle, Whiteside, Lee, and Crawford counties.

**[The new Region 1 mitigations \(available via this link\) being imposed are listed below and go into effect on Saturday, October 3:](#)**

- Bars and restaurants must close at 11pm and may reopen no earlier than 6am the following day.
- Bars and restaurants can serve patrons at tables with outdoor seating only. No indoor service or seating is allowed.
- No ordering, seating, or congregating at bar is allowed and it is recommended that bar stools be removed. No indoor service or seating is allowed.
- No standing or congregating indoors or outdoors while waiting for a table or exiting the premises.
- No dancing or standing indoors.
- Reservations required for each party.
- No seating of multiple parties at one table.
- Meetings, social events and gatherings are limited to the lesser of 25 people or 25% of overall room capacity. (This restriction modifies the previous limitation of the lesser of 50 people or 50% of overall room capacity.)
- All reception halls are closed.
- No party buses are allowed.
- Gaming and casinos must be closed by 11:00 p.m. and not reopen until 8:00 a.m. per the Illinois Gaming Board requirements. Food and beverage services in gaming establishments have been suspended. See link for additional Gaming Board requirements: <https://www.igb.illinois.gov/>.

Under the Illinois Liquor Control Act (235 ILCS 5/7-5), local liquor commissioners may temporarily cease the liquor license of a business found to be posing an immediate threat to the welfare of their community. The new mitigation efforts will remain in effect until Region 1 is able to reduce its seven-day rolling average positivity rate to or below 6.5% for 14 consecutive days. When the region is able to meet the 6.5% sustained positivity rate target, the region will be allowed to return to regular Phase 4 guidelines without these enhanced mitigations.
