Gov. Pritzker Names Brian Sullivan Commissioner of the Illinois Liquor Control Commission

Brian Sullivan has been appointed as a new Commissioner to the Illinois Liquor Control Commission (ILCC). He served as the Mayor of Hillsboro, Illinois from 2015 to 2020. As Mayor, he was the Local Liquor Commissioner with sole responsibility for issuing, enforcing, and monitoring liquor licenses as well as gaming licenses for the City of Hillsboro. During his term as mayor, he sponsored ordinances to allow, but regulate, micro-breweries and small batch distilleries within the city limits of Hillsboro.

Sullivan is a lifelong Pharmacist, he graduated from St. Louis College of Pharmacy. He is a third-generation pharmacy owner in central Illinois with locations in Hillsboro and Litchfield.

Sullivan develops commercial property for Atlas 46, located in Hillsboro, that employs 200 workers. Atlas 46 originated in Fenton, Missouri and has expanded to central Illinois. The company seeks to locate pods of workforce on main streets in Illinois towns, especially left vacant due to economic changes that have impacted the country. An expanded workforce in these blighted areas will not only increase traffic on their main streets but will bring new residents investing in housing and further business development. The ILCC is pleased to have Brian join us, his background and knowledge will be invaluable to the Illinois Liquor Control Commission.
