

■ Illinois IL-1040 Electronic Filing Program

TO: Taxpayers and Practitioners

Illinois is encouraging taxpayers to file their 1991 Illinois individual income tax returns electronically.

The program will apply only to taxpayers who are expecting a refund or have no balance due on their 1991 individual income tax returns. The program will not allow the direct deposit of refunds by electronic means.

TO: Taxpayers

How do I file?

You may use the services of any preparer or transmitter who has been accepted in both the IRS and Illinois programs.

What forms may I file electronically?

You may, through your preparer or transmitter, file the following forms:

- Form IL-1040, Illinois Individual Income Tax Return
- Schedule NR, Nonresident and Part-Year Resident Computation of Illinois Tax

- Form W-2, Wage and Tax Statement
- Form W-2G, Statement of Certain Gambling Winnings
- Form 1099-R, Total Distributions from Profit-Sharing, Retirement Plans, Individual Retirement Arrangements, Insurance Contracts, Etc.

If your return includes forms and schedules not listed above, you cannot file your return electronically.

When may I file electronically?

You may file between January 10, 1992, and April 15, 1992.

TO: Practitioners

Who may apply?

If you have been approved in the IRS electronic filing program, you may apply.

How do I apply?

You must submit Form IL-8633, Application to File 1991 Illinois Individual Income Tax Returns Electronically. We will conduct "suitability checks" to determine your eligibility.

What is the latest date I may apply?

We must receive your application by March 2, 1992.
