To: Owners of Qualified Solid Waste Energy Facilities

Beginning on and after January 1, 2001,
you must

- ◆ report payments that you receive
for kilowatt hours sold to electric
utilities, and
- ◆ pay the Illinois Department of
Revenue the amount due to the
Municipal Economic Development
Fund.

How does this differ from
the way I reported in the
past?

Since February 1999, you have been
required to report your payments
received for electricity sold and pay the
amount due to the Office of the State
Treasurer.

Is there a new form?

Yes. We have enclosed a supply of the
Form IDR-909, Qualified Solid Waste
Energy Facility Payment Form, on
which to file. You may photocopy one
of these blank forms for future use, or
you may order additional forms by
visiting our Web site at
www.revenue.state.il.us, calling our
fax-on-demand service at
217 785-3400, or calling our Forms
Order Line at **1 800 356-6302**.

When is my form and
payment due?

You must file Form IDR-909 and pay
any amount due on or before the 15th
day of the month following the month
for which you are reporting. (For ex-
ample, a form filed for April is due on or
before May 15.) If the due date falls on
a weekend or holiday then the return is
due on the next business day.

Can I file a single form if I
own more than one
facility?

No. You must file and pay separately
for each qualified facility you own.

Am I required to file a form
even if no payment is due?

Yes. You must file Form IDR-909 each
month. If the utility has not paid you for
the electricity you sold them, you will
report "no payment received" in Step 3
and write "0" on Line 8 in Step 4.

Has the information that I
report changed?

Yes. You must now report the electric
utility's service month and year for the
kilowatt hours that you have sold and
for which you are making payment.

Has the rate changed?

No. The rate remains six-tenths of a mill
(\$0.0006) per kilowatt hour.
