## **AGRICULTURAL AREAS**

### **2005 Annual Report**

The Illinois Department of Agriculture (IDOA), pursuant to the *Agricultural Areas Conservation and Protection Act (505 ILCS 5/20.1)*, is required to prepare an annual report to the General Assembly on the location and size of all agricultural areas (also known as ag areas) created, modified, or dissolved during the past year. The Act has had two modifications in the last two years regarding Sec. 5. Agricultural Areas; Creation. These changes are delineated on the following page. A copy of the complete Act is available at our web site listed below.

The Agricultural Areas Summary lists the 23 counties with local county board approved ag areas. This chart itemizes the number of agricultural areas in participating counties, along with their respective acres, and summarizes the total number of acres in approved ag areas throughout the state.

Two changes occurred in Illinois for the 2005 calendar year. The first dealt with the removal of 34 acres of cropland from the Jersey East Agricultural Area in Jersey County. The second involved the addition of 179 acres to the Steuben Twp - Ag Area B in Marshall County. The 2005 Summary of Agricultural Areas in Illinois chart has been updated to reflect these changes.

Following the 2005 Summary of Agricultural Areas chart are maps delineating the changes in the affected ag areas in Jersey and Marshall Counties. A total of 121,445 acres are currently enrolled in 56 ag areas in Illinois.



## Recent changes in the Agricultural Areas Conservation and Protection Act

(505 ILCS 5/5) (from Ch. 5, par. 1005)

**Sec. 5. Agricultural Areas; Creation.** Any owner or owners of land may submit a proposal to the county board for the creation of an agricultural area within such county. An agricultural area, at the creation of any such area, shall not be less than 350 acres in all counties with a population under 600,000 and not less than 100 acres in all counties with a population of 600,000 or more. Such proposal shall include a description of the proposed area, including the boundaries thereof. Such territory shall be as compact and nearly contiguous as feasible. If any portion of the proposed area is not contiguous to another portion of the proposed area, that non-contiguous portion must be no more than 1.5 miles from the nearest other portion of the proposed area as measured between the closest boundaries of the 2 portions. An area created under this Act shall be established for a period of ten years. No land shall be included in an agricultural area without the consent of the owner. No land within an agricultural area shall be used for other than agricultural production as described in Sections 3.01 and 3.02 of this Act. Agreements for the extraction of mineral resources duly agreed upon prior to the creation of an agricultural area shall be exempted from the use provisions of this Section. In addition, the extraction of mineral resources conducted pursuant to the Surface Coal Mining Land Conservation and Reclamation Act shall be considered temporary land use and shall be exempted from the use provisions of this Section. 
