Program Name	Law Enforcement Intern Program
Program Description	The board's intern program allows civilians to enter a police academy as a cadet without being hired by a police agency. This program is administered by the board and Southwestern Illinois College Police Academy in Belleville, Illinois. The cadet, after successfully completing the background investigation, is responsible for the payment of the tuition for the Basic Law Enforcement course at that academy. Upon successfully completing the academy and passing the State Certification Examination, the cadet is eligible to be hired by Illinois police agencies. However, if more than a year elapses from the date of graduation, the cadet must take an 80 hour transition course. If more than two years elapse before hiring, the prior training as a cadet is null and void.
Target Population	Prospective law enforcement officers.
Activities	The board recruits, trains and provides job search assistance to law enforcement interns.
Goals	To permit local governments to hire pre-screened and qualified self-trained individuals.
