Information Sharing for Public Safety

As part of a growing priority at the State of Illinois for cross-agency collaboration, efforts have been underway to improve information and data sharing. In an important step toward this goal, the [Illinois Law Enforcement Task Force](#) was formed to improve the collection and accessibility of public safety information. The seventeen-member Task Force from criminal justice, public safety, education, health and social services will soon present their preliminary findings to the General Assembly.

Technology Transforms SOI's Administrative Hearings

The [Illinois Bureau of Administrative Hearings](#) is another example of using technology for agency collaboration. The project brings together over 25 state agencies, who conduct administrative hearings, to determine best practices and tools to address the high volume of cases. The team has been restructuring the process by analyzing business requirements, workflows, case tracking and are using WebEx as the communication and scheduling tool for hearings. This effort is expected to bring positive progress to case backlogs.
