Enterprise Portfolio Management (EPM) for Applications

The EPM for Applications has proven to be a valuable repository for our transformation and modernization efforts. In December 2017, DoIT counted nearly 3,000 applications and was able to retire 192. This December, a total of 500 have been retired or decommissioned as a result of our statewide efforts to identify outdated applications. All agency CIOs were tasked with validating

their business applications, which has aided enterprise efforts with security business impact assessments and budget forecasting. A new tool is being configured, Application Portfolio Management (APM), that will assist in mapping our infrastructure to the business applications. More coming soon!



Antiquity to Meet Technology at Cahokia Mounds

The National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) recently awarded the Cahokia Mounds Museum Society (CMMS) a \$100,000 Digital Projects for the Humanities Grant to spend on an educational website and augmented reality app for smart phones and other platforms slated for release in 2020. Visitors will ultimately be able to look down from the 10-story Monks Mound through a smart phone to “see” structures that used to sit on the pre-Columbian site. Tourists to the site will have a leading-edge experience to the 1000-year-old civilization and archaeological site. 2018 End of the Year Report to the General Assembly

DoIT’s End of the Year Report is now complete in accordance with EO 2016-01. It was a productive year as we became an official agency by statute, moved personnel from the agencies to the DoIT payroll, built an Office of Strategy and Planning to lead our program management office functions and drive lean business practices, used analytics to identify tax fraud, established a comprehensive elections security program, expanded the use of centers of excellence in specialty IT areas, instituted full-encryption for data at rest and in-motion and launched cybersecurity awareness training for close to 46,000 state employees.
