### Importance of iPhone Updates

Is your State of Illinois cellphone running the most current iOS version? (13.4.1 is the most current version state phones can support) Keeping your operating system up to date will fix known security risks and keep your apps current. As we continue to rollout multi-factor authentication (MFA), it has become apparent that iPhones are not being updated. Employees are encountering issues adding their email application because the software is out of date. If you haven't already done so, your iOS should be brought up to date as soon as possible and please encourage your agency staff to do the same. To discover what operating system your phone is currently running (this is true for personal iPhones, as well), go to Settings>General>About. If you need to update, simply go to Settings>General>Software Update. The more behind the update, the longer it will take. Remember that updates go faster over a strong, secure wi-fi signal and plugged into a power supply. Updates will also strengthen your phone's security and functionality.

### Human Capital Management (HCM) – Next Wave of ERP
