Addendum to Communications Report with Illinois Power Agency for September 25, 2012 Teleconference

On September 25, 2012, Arlene Juracek, Acting Director, Michael Strong, Chief Counsel, and Mario Bohorquez, Chief Financial Officer, for the Illinois Power Agency, participated in a conference call with representatives of the FutureGen Industrial Alliance.

Summary of Substantive Content of Communication:

The participants discussed the following substantive matters/issues during the meeting:

- Mr. Champagne explained that he requested the call so as to provide an update to the IPA regarding discussions the FutureGen Alliance had recently held with representatives of ComEd and Ameren regarding the proposed sourcing agreement for the FutureGen 2.0 project. Mr. Champagne advised that the FutureGen Alliance had agreed to accept and incorporate several changes proposed by the utilities into the sourcing agreement, and that the parties were still discussing other issues relating to the agreement.
- Mr. Champagne said that the FutureGen Alliance would be submitting a revised version of the sourcing agreement to the IPA for inclusion in the final 2013 Procurement Plan. Mr. Champagne also said that the FutureGen Alliance was still in the process of preparing a revised project cost and ratepayer impact report. He said that the Alliance was making a few changes to the report based on feedback received from the Alliance's financial advisors and the U.S. Department of Energy. Mr. Champagne advised that the Alliance would be providing the IPA with an updated version of an Executive

Summary for the project cost and ratepayer impact report for inclusion in the 2013 Procurement Plan. Mr. Champagne stated that the Alliance would be attaching an updated version of the complete project cost and ratepayer impact report as an exhibit to the Alliance's Objections and Response to the 2013 Procurement Plan.

- Director Juracek asked whether the changes to the project cost and ratepayer impact report would affect the work that Levitan & Associates was performing to create a cost-based clean coal benchmark to evaluate the FutureGen 2.0 project. Mr. Champagne advised that it might affect Levitan's calculations, so Mr. Champagne said the Alliance would deliver a copy of the revised (confidential) project cost and ratepayer impact report to Levitan.
- Director Juracek stated that the IPA needed to indicate in the Procurement Plan when the cost-based, clean coal benchmark would be ready. She asked whether Mr. Champagne would communicate that request to Levitan when Mr. Champagne contacted Levitan about the revised project cost and ratepayer impact report. Mr. Champagne said that he would do so.
- Director Juracek asked whether the FutureGen Alliance had engaged in any additional discussions about the sourcing agreement with any alternative retail electric suppliers. Mr. Champagne said that the Alliance had not had any additional discussions with any alternative retail electric suppliers, but that the Alliance had delivered a revised copy of the sourcing agreement to representatives of all or most of the alternative retail electric suppliers. Director Juracek said that the alternative retail electric suppliers were probably avoiding additional engagement on the sourcing agreement in order to protect their legal positions.
