## **ITEM 4 - DIVISIONAL REPORTS**

Mr. Pat Polick, Interim Chief Inspector, presented the Divisional Reports for September - November, 2019. Please see the attached sheet for information.

Regarding number of violations, Mr. Polick reported that there are approximately 2500 on-going violations for resolution.

OSFM reported that they have sent out letters to owners of objects to collect past due fees.

- The Chief Inspector, Assistant Chief, position and Cook County job descriptions have been revised per Mr. Polick. A meeting is scheduled with HR to review the revised job descriptions and re-post them.
- The Boiler Safety Training conference was held October 29 through 31, 2019 in Springfield, IL. It was well attended by approximately 20 insurance inspectors. It was reported that the Boiler Safety Division is considering making Boiler Safety Training an annual event.
- All of Mr. Polick's inspectors have received their updated National Board commissions.

- Regarding administrative action for Code and Standards edition updates, Mr. Andryk provided information to the Board showing the updated editions of the ASME Boiler and Pressure Vessel Code (2019), National Board Inspection Code (2019), API 510 (Addendum 1 May, 2017 and Addendum 2 March, 2018), ASME CSD-1 (2018) and NFPA 85 (2019).
