WILLIAMSON COUNTY EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD PSAP REDUCTION PLAN

The state 911 statute requires that each County system serving fewer than 100,000 people have only one ETSB and no more than two PSAPs. As required, the Williamson County ETSB, which had two PSAPs, merged with the city of Marion ETSB, which had one, resulting in a three PSAP system. All three were part of an ESINet and a regional next-generation system, but the ETSB was forced to figure out a way to answer the same number of calls with fewer people.

Calls had been distributed roughly 40% to the Sheriff, 33 percent to Marion and 27 percent to Herrin. None of the existing facilities are large enough for one central PSAP. None were willing to pay their people to work from a combined center. The cost of building a new center is prohibitive and not eligible for grant reimbursement. That option was rejected. The agreed upon plan calls for elimination of the Sheriff's PSAP since both the Marion and Herrin Police Departments were willing to increase staff to take on larger call loads. The groundwork for implementation of that plan is well underway and should be completed by late August.

Based on facilities, staffing levels, and geographic diversity, the committee recommended that 911 calls be answered by the Marion and Herrin Police Departments. This required upgrades to those departments so they could and answer and direct dispatch all of the calls previously handled by the Sheriff.

Currently, the Sheriff's PSAP has two manned positions and one backup. The Marion PSAP has two manned positions, one backup position, and space for one more. The Herrin PSAP has two manned positions but space is being created for one more. The Marion PSAP agreed to hire three additional dispatchers. The Herrin PSAP agreed to switch CAD systems so that they could be on the same system as Marion. The Sheriff's Department could not afford additional personnel or new jail and RMS software that a CAD switch would require. With the CSI Next-Gen system in place, changing the call routing requires a PSAP boundary change for landline calls and tower ESRK reassignments for wireless. Adjacent agency agreements had to be updated but all participating agency agreements remain unchanged.

Since agreeing to this plan, we have upgraded and expanded the radio and recording systems at Marion Police so that they can direct dispatch every agency in the county. A fourth 911 and radio position has just been added, using the former third position hardware from the sheriff's department. We have trained all of Marion's dispatchers in EMD and are working with our new resource hospital on certifying both PSAPs with the IDPH. All of the dispatchers were already certified individually. Marion had previously transferred medical calls to Lifeline Ambulance, the practice followed by the former Marion ETSB before becoming part of the county system.

The electrical system at the Herrin Police Department has been upgraded with a new larger UPS, improved generator setup and additional outlets in the dispatch center. Instead of costly renovations, we have replaced the existing furniture to make room for a third position. One of the existing sheriff's positions will be moved to Herrin once the consolidation plan is approved. The remaining hardware from the sheriff's department will be kept as a spares.

The end result will be four positions at Marion with three to four staffed depending on the time of day, and three positions at Herrin with two normally staffed. The Sheriff's dispatch center will no longer answer 911 calls but they will still be staffed by the county to handle alarms, ten digit calls, jail and courthouse related issues, and handle officer requests for license plate, driver's license and criminal history information. They remain the MABAS dispatch center for the area.

The committee examined call volume data over the past six months to determine where the landline and cell phone 911 calls were originating. Currently, Herrin answers calls from Herrin, Energy and Johnston City. Marion answers calls from the immediate Marion area and the Sheriff answers calls from the smaller towns, rural areas and interstate highways. The new configuration calls for Johnston City calls to now go to Marion. The original reason those calls had gone to Herrin in the late 1990s is no longer relevant and Johnston City and Marion are separated by a few miles along Interstate 57. The cities of Herrin, Energy, Carterville, Cambria, and Crainville have all grown together into one contiguous polygon of about twenty thousand people in the northwest quarter of the county. Herrin will handle calls from that "metro" area.

The ETSB has purchased a new CAD system for Herrin from IDNetworks, which is the company that Marion uses. Herrin's long-time CAD vendor, EmergiTech, was purchased by Zuercher Technologies and is no longer supported. The CAD upgrade required a new server and workstations and network hardware to connect them to Marion. The city of Herrin purchased the associated record management system from IDNetworks.

As detailed in the attached call volume report, Marion will end up with about 65% of the landline calls and 71 % of the wireless calls, or a total of 70% overall. About 85% of all of our calls are now wireless. Herrin's call volume will remain the same so they will not additional full-time staffing; however, they will increase the number of part-time hours worked to fill more shifts. Both Police Department PSAPs will direct dispatch all rural and small town calls which had previously been transferred to the Sheriff for dispatch. The ETSB will increase the amount of dispatch grant money it provides to help offset the additional staffing level. Instead of \$3,000 per month per PSAP for a total of \$9,000, the amount will increase to \$14,000 with Marion getting \$9000 and Herrin \$5000 per month. The Sheriff will no longer get a dispatch grant.

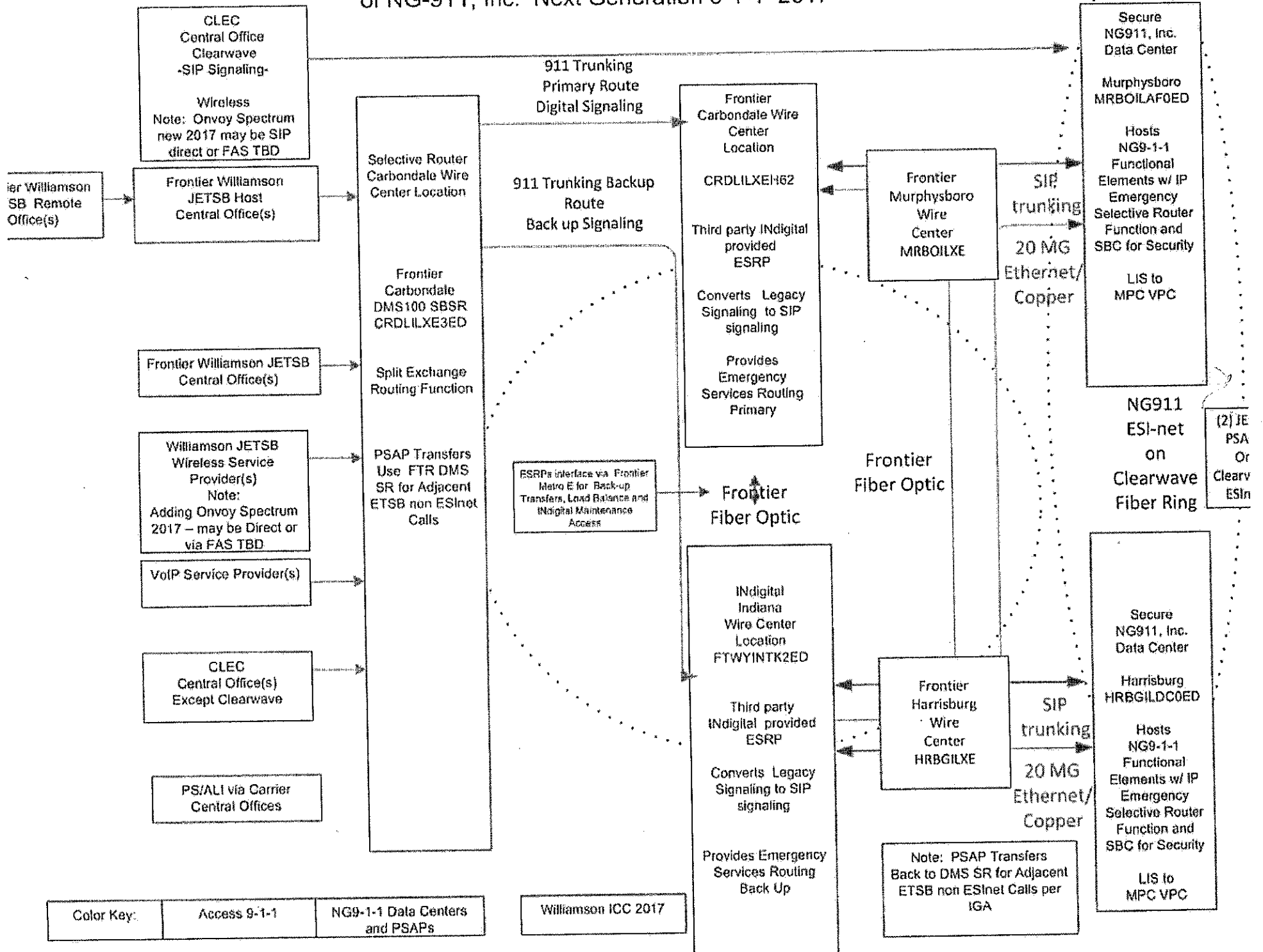
There is no change to any of the participating agency agreements. The same methods will be used to dispatch participating police, fire and ambulance services. Marion and Herrin Police will only transfer calls to State police for Interstate incidents and to Abbott Ambulance, which is not located in the county, because of their contract with Johnston City. Neighboring systems that are part of the CSI system (Union, Saline, Jackson and Johnson Counties) that need to transfer calls to Williamson County will send them to either Herrin or Marion through the ESINet rather than to the Sheriff's PSAP. Franklin County will transfer calls to the Marion Police Department for dispatch. Those revised agreements are included in this plan application. The Williamson County PSAPs receiving calls from a neighboring CSI-member county will transfer using the ESINet. Franklin County calls will use the pre-set router transfers provided by Frontier.

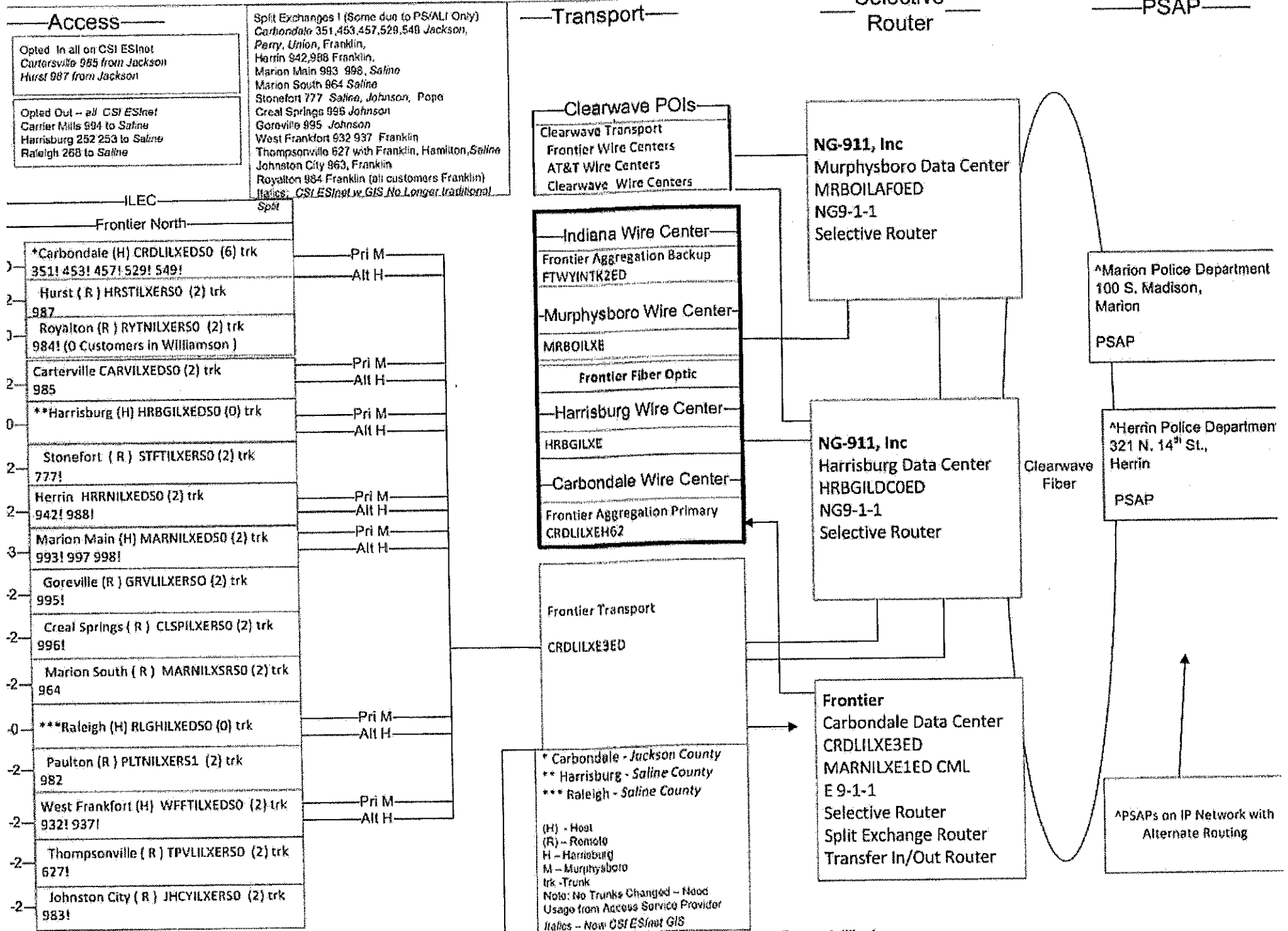
The ETSB will continue to be appointed one third by the county board chairman, one third by the Marion Mayor and one third by the Herrin Mayor. The ETSB will continue to employ a Coordinator and pay Marion's GIS person a monthly fee for his services. Because Williamson County is part of a regional Next-Gen system, the network charges do not change based on the number of PSAPs. The Next-Gen maintenance cost also stays the same because it is divided evenly among CSI members, not based on PSAPs or positions. We will save \$750 per year by having to pay one fewer mapping position license. Our recurring CAD maintenance expense will stay the same, adding Marion and dropping the Sheriff. The Clearwave ESINet cost, paid by the state, will drop by \$3000 per year, but the ETSB will add \$4200 per year for the direct CAD connection between the city PSAPs.

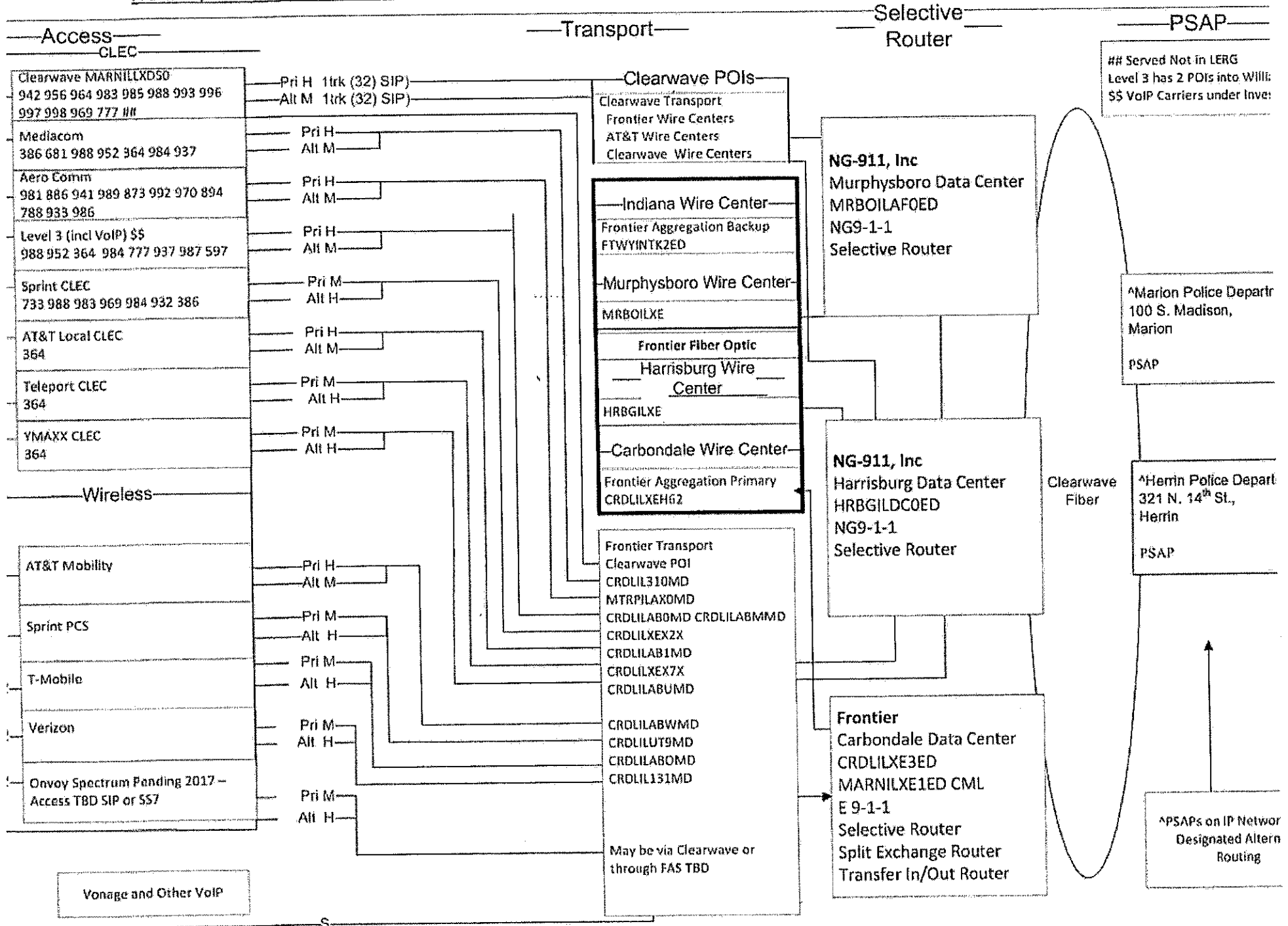
The number of dispatchers we are responsible for training should drop from 28 to 23. Radio maintenance costs will stay the same since each PSAP had already been paying their own. The consolidation will save the ETSB the cost of replacing old furniture at the Sheriff's PSAP (about \$40,000) and could reduce the cost of a future replacement of the Solacom Next-gen positions by one (about \$5,000).

Consolidation costs at Marion include \$75,000 in radio system upgrades, \$6,000 in Powerphone EMD training and \$3,000 for an additional 911 position. At Herrin, costs include \$6000 for a new UPS and electrical upgrades, \$35,000 for new furniture, \$54,000 for a new CAD system, plus \$15,000 for a server, work stations and network connections. \$58,000 for the Powerphone CACH call-handling system would assure that all calls are handled expertly at both PSAPs, which will be absorbing the calls formerly handled by the sheriff's department. That totals about \$252,000 in consolidation costs. We will be applying for a consolidation grant in early 2018. The biggest cost increase resulting from the consolidation will be an additional \$60,000 in annual dispatch grants. Under the current three-PSAP system, the agencies combine to spend about \$1.7 million dollars on dispatch salaries and benefits. The amount provided by the two PSAP agencies will drop to about \$1.2 million.






Due to a state mandate reducing the number of PSAPs in rural counties, the Williamson County Sheriff's dispatch will no longer be a PSAP. The Marion Police Department will dispatch for the rural areas in Williamson County that are adjacent to Franklin County. This includes the Sheriff's Department, the Williamson County Ambulance Service and the Williamson County Fire Protection District.

The Franklin County Sheriff's PSAP dispatches for the rural areas in Franklin County that are adjacent to Williamson County. This includes the Sheriff's department, Hurst Fire and Ambulance Service, the Williamson County Ambulance Service, The Freemanspur Police Department and the Williamson County Fire Protection District.

Therefore, when a 9-1-1 call for police or ambulance service in Franklin County is answered at a Williamson County PSAP, the call will be transferred to the Franklin County Sheriff's PSAP. When a call for fire response is answered it will be transferred to the West Frankfort Police Department PSAP. Any 9-1-1 call for service in Williamson County answered by a Franklin County PSAP will be transferred to the Marion Police PSAP. The phone numbers for transfer will be 997-7500 for Marion Police, 438-4841 for the Franklin County Sheriff at 937-3502 for West Frankfort Police.

Each emergency service agency will be dispatched in the manner detailed in the participating agency agreement currently in place between the agency and sheriff's PSAP, which are on file with the Illinois Commerce Commission and/or the Illinois State Police. If an emergency unit is dispatched in response to a 9-1-1 request for service and subsequently determined that the location is outside its jurisdiction, it shall render aid without regard to boundaries until relieved. Responders shall follow all established mutual aid procedures and agreements already in effect.

ADJACENT AGENCY AGREEMENT BETWEEN

THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY JOINT EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD AND THE JACKSON COUNTY EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM BOARD

The state of Illinois has enacted the Emergency Telephone System Act at 50 ILCS 750/p.01 et seq. which requires all Emergency Telephone System Boards to have agreements with adjacent systems for handling misrouted calls for service. The PSAPs in Williamson, Jackson, Union, Johnson and Saline Counties et.al. are all connected with an ESINet to provide next-generation 911 service.

Due to a state mandate reducing the number of PSAPs in rural counties, the Williamson County Sheriff's dispatch will no longer be a PSAP. The Marion Police Department will dispatch for the rural areas in Williamson County that are adjacent to Jackson County. This includes the Sheriff's Department the Lake of Egypt Ambulance and Fire Department and Ambulance Service, the Cambria Fire and Ambulance Service and the Hurst Police, Fire and Ambulance Service.

The Jackson County Sheriff's PSAP dispatches for the rural areas in Jackson County that are adjacent to Williamson County. This includes the Sheriff's department, the Jackson County Ambulance Service, and the Makanda and DeSoto Township Fire Departments. However, the Carbondale Police PSAP dispatches the Carbondale Police and Fire Departments and Carbondale Township Fire.

Therefore, when a 9-1-1 call for service in Jackson County is answered at a Williamson County PSAP, the call will be transferred by ESINet to either the Jackson County Sheriff's PSAP or the Carbondale PSAP depending on the location. Any 9-1-1 call for service in Williamson County that is answered by the Jackson County PSAP will be transferred by ESINet to the Marion Police Department. In the event that the ESINet is down, the calls will be transferred to the 10-digit phone numbers 618-997-7500 for Marion; 618-684-2177 for Jackson County or 618-549-2121 for Carbondale Police.

Each emergency service agency will be dispatched in the manner detailed in the participating agency agreement currently in place between the agency and the PSAP, which are on file with the Illinois Commerce Commission and/or the Illinois State Police. If an emergency unit is dispatched in response to a 9-1-1 request for service and subsequently determined that the location is outside its jurisdiction, it shall render aid without regard to boundaries until relieved. Responders shall follow all established mutual aid procedures and agreements already in effect.

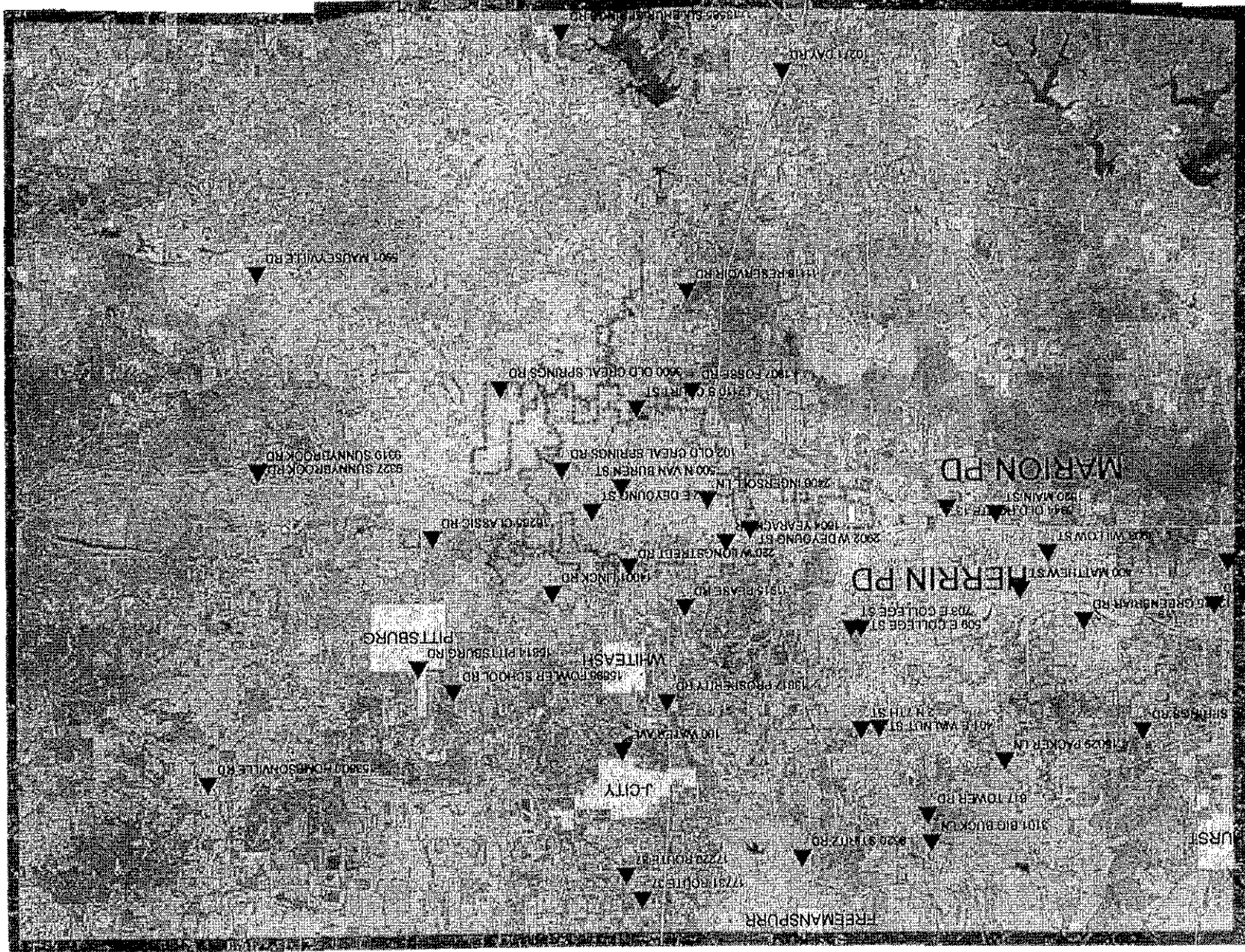

The removal of the PSAP designation for the Williamson County Sheriff's dispatch will require the following changes to the routing of calls from these tower sectors.

SPRINT 1512 Main St Crainville.....19084 Limb Branch Ln..... and 17226 Route 37 were all previously ESRK range 8505-8518 which went to the Sheriff's Department. The Limb Branch and Route 37 towers should be reassigned to the Marion Police ESRK which is 7320-7333. The old Sheriff's range could be redesignated for the Herrin Police Department PSAP.

T-MOBILE 2 n 7TH St Herrin and 1512 S Main St Crainville, which had been ESRK range 8218-8266 and assigned to the Sheriff, should instead be changed to a new range routed to the Herrin Police PSAP. All other T-Mobile towers serving Williamson County could keep the old range but be routed to the Marion PSAP.

ATT Mobility has three ranges currently with 9529-9538 going to Marion, 9973- to 9982 going to Herrin and 9953-9962 going to the Sheriff. The 3308 Sycamore Rd, 509 E College St and 903 Willow St towers should be redirected from the Sheriff's range to the Herrin range. All other towers now directed to the Sheriff should instead be routed to the Marion PSAP range. The 100 Water Ave and 16444 Route 37 towers that had been directed to the Herrin range should be switched to Marion.

VERIZON WIRELESS has three ranges 9350-9363 go to Herrin, 6078-9091 go to the Marion PSAP and 9062-9097 go to the Sheriff's PSAP. The 400 Matthew St, 1413 W Grand Ave and 12994 Greenbriar Rd towers should be shifted from the sheriff to Herrin. All of the other towers in the sheriff's range should be shifted to Marion. The 100 Water Ave; 8386 Old Route 13, and 311 Grand Ave towers should be changed from Herrin to Marion.

Any towers in neighboring counties that have a sector being routed to the Williamson County Sheriff should instead be routed to Marion Police.




