

# STATE OF ILLINOIS



## Proclamation

*WHEREAS, computer science (CS) is a foundational subject that engages students academically, provides opportunities to foster critical thinking and problem solving skills, and offers pathways to prosperous careers; and,*

*WHEREAS, computing jobs are the number one source of new wages in the United States and account for the majority of new Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) jobs; and,*

*WHEREAS, 91 percent of available STEM jobs are outside of Silicon Valley; and,*

*WHEREAS, nearly 24,000 computing jobs open in Illinois each month, with roughly 2,800 graduates from Illinois universities available to fill those positions; and,*

*WHEREAS, only 49 percent of Illinois schools currently offer foundational CS courses; and,*

*WHEREAS, the need to make CS learning in Illinois more equitable remains imperative as only 32 percent of women and 6 percent of Black students are participating in key learning opportunities; and,*

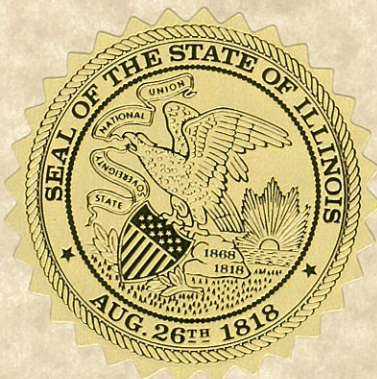
*WHEREAS, Public Act 101-0654 requires all Illinois school districts to ensure students receive developmentally appropriate opportunities to gain computer literacy skills beginning in elementary school; and,*

*WHEREAS, the Illinois State Board of Education recently adopted a rigorous K-12 computer science knowledge and skill continuum to support students in progressively developing computational skills to prepare for today and tomorrow's data-rich and interconnected world,*

*THEREFORE, I, JB Pritzker, Governor of the State of Illinois, do hereby proclaim December 5-11 as **Computer Science Education Week** in Illinois.*
