WHEREAS, critical infrastructure sectors are increasingly reliant on information systems and technology to support financial services, energy, telecommunications, transportation, utilities, health care, and emergency response systems; and,

WHEREAS, Cybersecurity education and awareness is crucial for anyone who connects to the internet, be it with a computer, mobile phone, or other internet-connected devices, as critical infrastructure is increasingly reliant on the support of information systems and technology; and,

WHEREAS, enabling multi-factor authentication, using strong passwords, updating software, recognizing and reporting phishing, and using mobile devices and other internet-connected devices safely are ways people and organizations can protect themselves from phishing, viruses, ransomware, other malware, financial loss, and loss of sensitive data; and,

WHEREAS, the National Cybersecurity Awareness campaign focuses on raising awareness of the importance of cybersecurity and ensuring that all Americans have the resources they need to be safer and more secure online; and,

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois, the Illinois Department of Innovation & Technology, the Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency, the National Cybersecurity Alliance, and the Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center all recognize October as National Cybersecurity Awareness Month - all citizens are encouraged to visit the staysafeonline.org and the stop.think.connect.org websites to learn about cybersecurity and put that knowledge into practice in their homes, schools, workplaces, and businesses;

THEREFORE, I, JB Pritzker, Governor of the State of Illinois, do hereby proclaim October 2022 as Cybersecurity Awareness Month in Illinois.
